EDUCATION

After School Matters

Provides after-school and summer program opportunities to Chicago high school teens. Chicago Teens participate in high quality, hands-on, project-based apprenticeship and internship programs in a variety of content areas, including the arts, communications and leadership, sports, and STEM. Eligible teens receive stipends for completion of program requirements.

Brighton Park Neighborhood Council - Community Schools

Provides structured educational and enrichment activities for children and teens, including homework and studying help, through its after-school programs. Additionally offers English as a Second Language (ESL) and high school equivalency classes and testing for adults. Services are free.

<u>Center for Independence Through Conductive Education</u>

Provides group-based intensive motor training programs for children and adolescents with Cerebral Palsy and other physical disabilities. Additionally offers a range of support programs including sibling support groups, parent education nights, home-visit training programs, educational advocacy, medical advocacy, and comprehensive case management services. Programming is also available for young adults ages 18-25, with a focus on socialization skills, activities of daily life, community integration, and vocational training. Services are provided to individuals who are insured and uninsured, regardless of ability to pay. The Center has a Brighton Park location at 2701 W. 36th Place.

EDUCATION

Gads Hill Center- Brighton Park

MENTAL HEALTH

Riveredge Hospital

Offers inpatient and outpatient mental health services to children and adolescents, as well as inpatient and intensive outpatient mental health services for adults. Accepts most types of insurance and may also provide financial assistance to individuals who are eligible.

YOUTH VIOLENCE PREVENTION

New Life Centers of Chicagoland

Provides mentoring and group programming to youth (ages 12-24) who are at risk of becoming involved in the criminal justice system. Group programming includes trauma-informed peace circles, adventure play therapy, cognitive behavioral therapy, and sports-based programming. They also offer a pop-up food pantry at New Life Church at 4155 S. Rockwell St. on Tuesdays from 4:30-6:30pm.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Offers support applying for health insurance benefits and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Additionally assists eligible households in reconnecting or paying for gas, propane, electricity, and/or water through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP).

Ladder Up

Offers free tax preparation services, financial coaching, and assistance completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) college financial aid application. Can also assist taxpayers in applying for and renewing an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN). Offers a Legal Tax Clinic for low-income individuals and families who have a controversy with the IRS or Illinois Department of Revenue.
